Re:Sound Proposes Satellite Radio Tariff for 2011

Toronto, 17 July, 2010 – Re:Sound Music Licensing Company announced today a proposal for a Satellite Radio Tariff 4 for 2011. The proposal, which was filed with the Copyright Board of Canada on March 31, 2010, is a renewal of the current Satellite Radio Tariff, which applies to the years 2007 to 2010.

The proposed tariff seeks the same royalty rates that were initially proposed by Re:Sound for 2007 to 2010. It also includes some changes to the tariff's administrative provisions, based on Re:Sound's experience administering the current tariff.
