How to calculate your licence fee

Your fee is based on 3 factors: the number of months your venue operates during the year, your venue’s capacity, and the number of days of the week the venue is open for dancing.

PART 1: Calculate your base fee

Use the following chart to determine your base fee for each year of music used for dancing for the first 100 people your venue will hold. The corresponding dollar figure shows your base fee.

Venue operates for 6 months or less a year and during that time is open for dancing:		Venue operates for more than 6 months a year and during that time is open for dancing:	
1 to 3 days a week	\$151.19	1 to 3 days a week	\$302.38
4 to 7 days a week	\$302.38	4 to 7 days a week	\$604.76

If your venue holds no more than 100 people, enter your base fee(s) for the applicable year(s) that music was used for dancing into Column A of the chart in **Part 2**.

If your venue holds more than 100 people, enter your base fee(s) into Column A of the chart in **Part 2** and complete Columns B and C to calculate your full licence fee.

PART 2: Calculate your total fee

If your venue’s capacity is over 100 people, the total fee increases by 10% with every increment of 20 additional people. For example, 101 to 120 people increases the fee by 10%; for 121 to 140 people the fee increases by 20%, and so on.

To assist you in calculating your licence fee, the formula has been simplified in the following table:

* $(B \div 200 + 0.5)$ accounts for the incremental percentage increase based on your total capacity which includes the first 100 people and the remaining increments of 20 people.
